## What is a Patient Family Advisory Committee (PFAC)?

## What are we looking for in an Advisory Committee member?

We are seeking individuals who represent a cross-section of our community, including patients (inpatient or outpatient), family members, and interested community members.

- Influence the direction of activities, services, and policies at the hospital. Your opinion matters.

## How long will I be on the committee and what is the time commitment?

The Council normally meets once every three months for approximately one hour. We endeavor to hold the meetings during the lunch hour. Additional work may be required between meetings. We ask Advisory Council members to make a one to two-year commitment and to attend at least 75% of the meetings.
